What is NACE?

The National Association of County Engineers, NACE is a nonprofit, non-partisan professional association in its sixth decade representing county engineers and professional road managers. Our over 1,900 members consist of county engineers, highway superintendents, road masters, parish engineers, road supervisors, highway administrators, transportation directors, public works directors, road operations managers, and other titles for professional road and bridge managers.

Nationwide, local roads account for about 75% of the nation's highways and roads (about 2.93 million miles). Counties manage about 1.74 million miles of those roads while cities and townships account for another 1.19 million miles. Counties also own 231,000 bridges and operate one third of the nation's transit systems. This is important to remember not only because of the large mileage but also because just about all travel of people and goods starts and ends on local roads. Thus, local roads are a vital element of our nation's highway system. *Local Roads Matter!*

NACE has 4 Prime Objectives:

- 1. To advance county engineering and management by providing a forum for exchange of ideas and information aimed at improving service to the public.
- 2. To foster and stimulate growth of individual state orgs. of county engineers and county road officials.
